Summary Report on Training Programme Evaluation Comprehensive Course on Natural Disaster – Cyclone

1.0 Introduction

Gujarat Institute of Disaster Management (GIDM) conducted a five day training programme on 'Comprehensive Course on Natural Disaster – Cyclone'. Thirty five participants attended the programme from various districts (refer annexure 1 for details of participants). This evaluation report comprises of the feedback received from the participants.

The letter dated 28.04.2009 inviting nominations for the training programme was sent from the Jt.CEO, GSDMA and Executive Director, GIDM to ACS, Home; PS, Panchayat, Rural Housing and Rural Development; PS, Revenue; PS, Urban Housing and Urban Development; PS, Civil Supplies; PS, Health & Family Welfare; PS, Narmada, Water Resources, Water Supply and Kalpsar; DGP, Training; CEO, Gujarat Maritime Board; MD, Civil Supplies Corporation; Chairman, Water Supply and Sewerage Board; Commissioner, Fisheries; Secretary, Roads & Buildings Department; Secretary, Education; Development Commissioner; Commissioner of Relief; Commissioner of Health, Medical Services and Medical Education; MD, Gujarat Urja Vikas Nigam Limited; Director, Civil Defense; Municipal Commissioners, Rajkot, Bhavnagar, Jamnagar, Junagadh and All Collectors.

1.1. Objectives

The course objectives were:

- To get an overview about Cyclones
- To understand Hazard, Risk & Vulnerability Assessment of Cyclones to Gujarat
- To know about Cyclone Forecasting and Warning and Emergency Relief and Recovery Measures
- To understand Cyclone Mitigation Measures
- To look at Cyclone Preparedness & Emergency Response Planning
- To get insight into Emergency Response in Cyclone
- To know about Pre hospital Care : CPR and First Aid
- To understand Cyclone as a disaster through Case studies
- To get an overview on Water, Sanitation and Health Management in Cyclones

1.2 Duration

The duration of the training programme was for 5 days from 26th to 30th May, 2009.

1.3 Venue

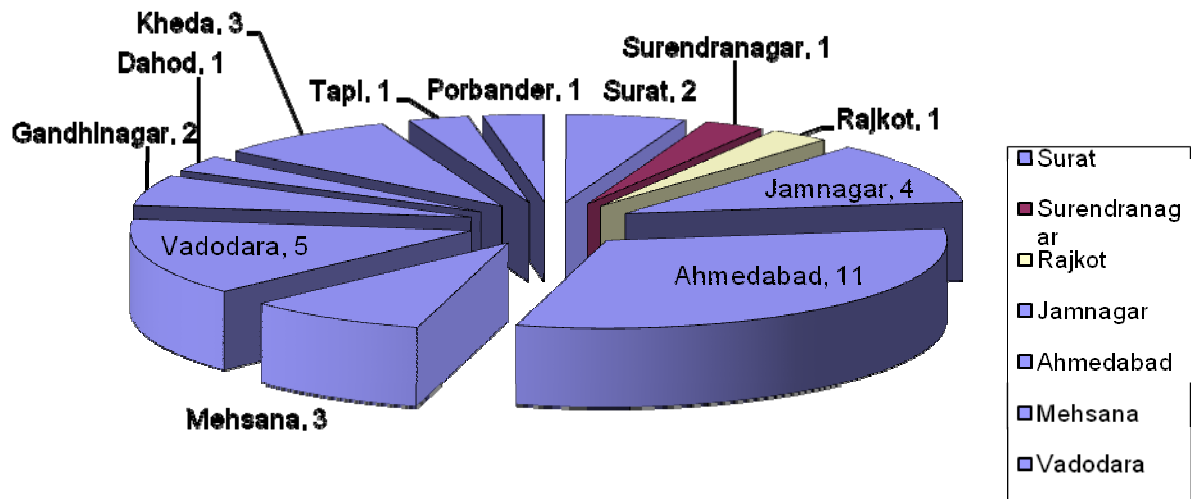
The venue of the training programme was the Sardar Patel Institute of Public Administration campus situated opposite ISRO on Satellite Road at Ahmedabad. GIDM has an office in the same campus.

1.4 Methodology Used

In the programme, the methodology used was lecture, presentation, demonstration, screening audio-visual, case study, discussion and exercise. The demonstration of Emergency Response equipments was out of lecture room.

1.5 Participants

There were thirtyfive participants in the training programme. The participants were on posts such as Additional Collector & Deputy Controller, Deputy Collector, Mamlatdar, Asst. Director Health & Medical, Deputy Commissioner of Industries and General Manager, Superintending Engineer, Chief Warden, Deputy Divisional Warden, Warden, Post Warden, Deputy Engineer, Junior Engineer, Additional Chitnish to Collector, Section Officer, Police Inspector, Mamlatdar,

Sub-Inspector Instructor, Assistant Fire Officer, Deputy SP, Police Inspector, Deputy Manager and CITI Manager.

1.6 Resource Persons

The programme coordinators were Jagdish Gadhavi, Deputy Director, GIDM and Pratima Singh, Assistant Professor, GIDM. The sessions were taken by GIDM officials (Jagdish Gadhavi and Pratima Singh) and other experts such as Tejas Patel, Dr.Kamaljit Ray, S.J.Pandit, Mr.Ansari, M.F.Dastoor, Dr.Uttama Solanki and Dr.P.L.Dave (copy of Programme Schedule is enclosed at annexure 2).

2.0 Evaluation of Programme by Participants

The training programme was very much appreciated by the participants. A brief summary of feed back received vide the evaluation reports (summary is given in annexure 3) has been presented hereafter.

2.1 Structure and organization of the course

About one thirds (11 out of 35) thought that the course was very well structured whereas the 20 participants thought that the course was well structured. One participant thought that the course was somewhat structured.

2.2 Usefulness of the training programme to job

Almost half (17 out of 35) of the participants found the training to be very useful in their jobs whereas 13 participants thought that the training was quite useful in their jobs.

2.3 Practical orientation of the course

More than two thirds of the participants felt that the training was practically oriented to a great extent.

2.4 Benefit from interaction with fellow participants

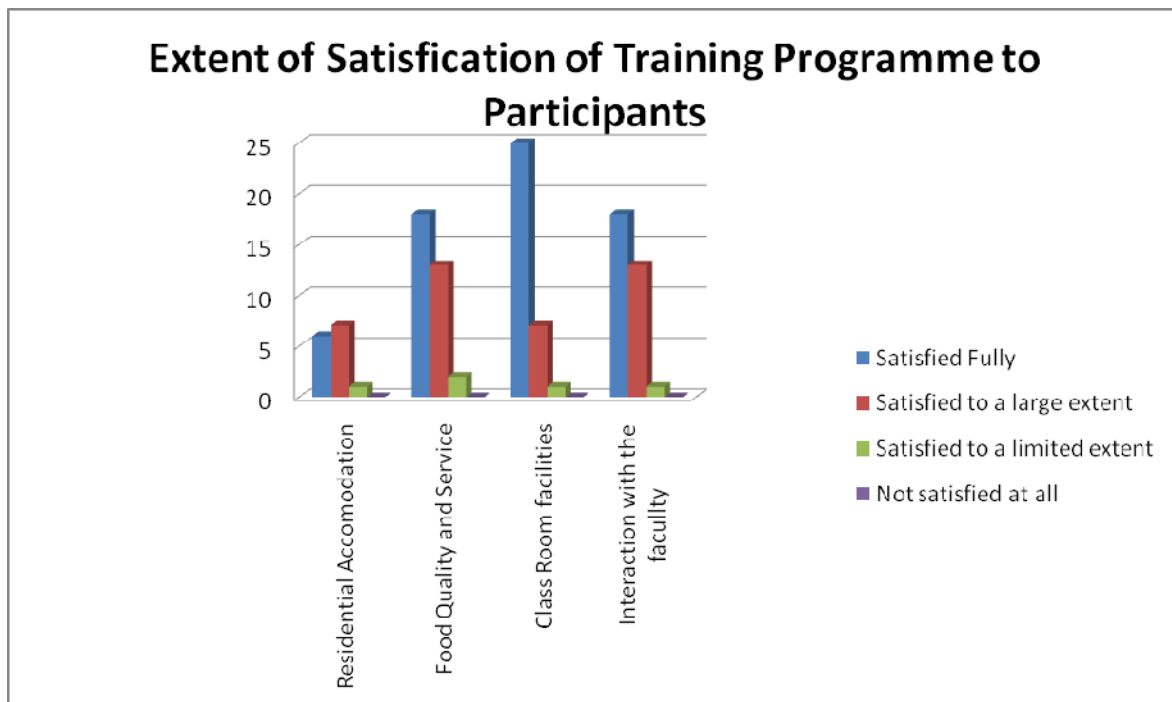
Nineteen participants felt that they had benefited 'considerably' from the interaction they had had with the fellow participants in the course. Eight participants stated that they had benefited 'substantially' from interaction with the fellow participants in the course. Four participants felt that they had benefitted 'fairly' from interaction with the fellow participants in the course.

2.5 Relevance of course material to the course content

More than half (20 out of 35) of the participants found the course material supplied to them 'considerably' relevant and related to the course content whereas nine participants found the course material supplied to them 'extremely' relevant and related to the course content. Four participants found the course material supplied to them as fairly relevant and related to the course course content.

2.6 Extent of Satisfaction of Training Programme to Participants

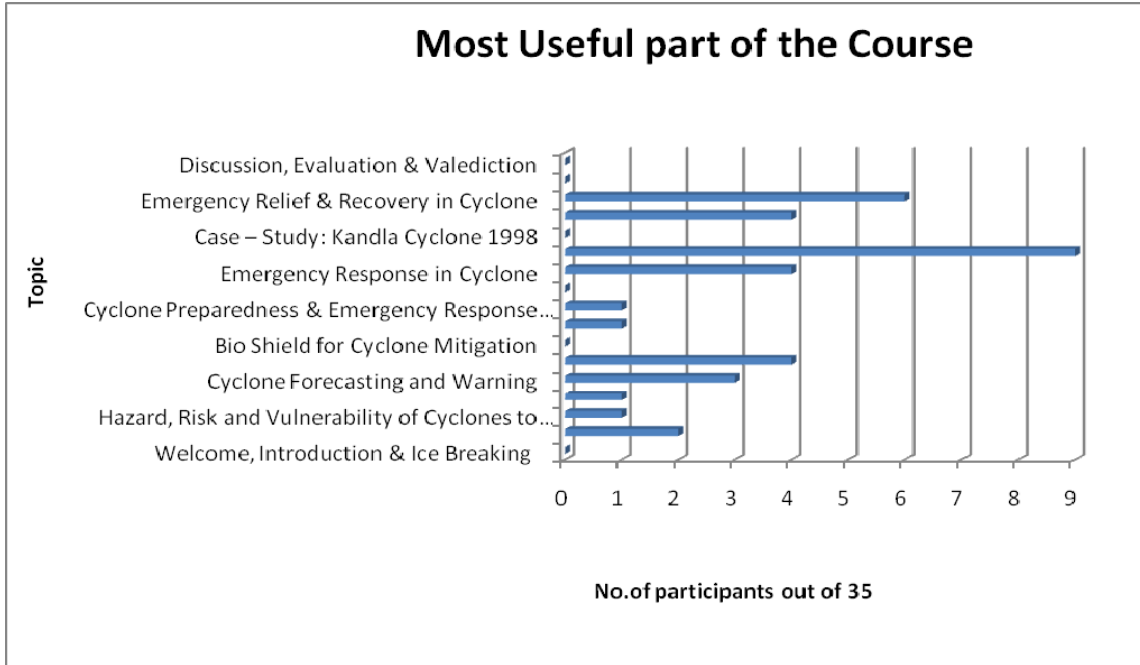
Level of satisfaction was distributed across various aspects of the training programme such as 'residential accommodation', 'food quality and service', 'class room facilities' and 'interaction with the faculty'. Maximum (25 out of 35) of the participants were satisfied fully when it came to the aspect of 'class room facilities'.



2.7 Faculty

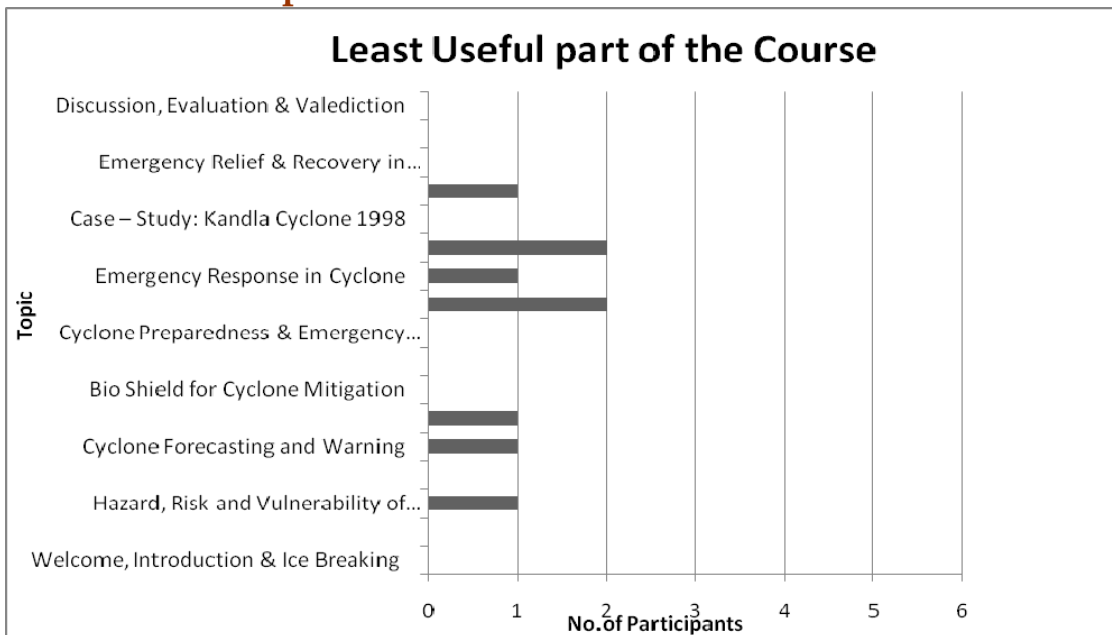
The participants found all the faculty members Jagdish Gadhavi, Pratima Singh, Tejas Patel, Dr.Kamaljit Ray, S.J.Pandit, Mr.Ansari, M.F.Dastoor, Dr.Uttama Solanki and Dr.P.L.Dave to be delivering lectures/sessions that ranged from excellent to very good to good to fair.

2.8 Most Useful part of the course



Nine participants found the topics - 'Pre Hospital Care : Triage, CPR & first Aid' to be the most useful part of the course. This was followed by the topic 'Emergency Relief & Recovery in Cyclone' which six participants found as the most useful part of the course. The topics 'Cyclone Mitigation Measures', 'Emergency Response in Cyclone', 'Water, Sanitation and Health Management in Cyclone' were found to be the most useful part of the course by four participants.

2.9 Least Useful part of the course



Two participants found the topics 'Pre Hospital Care : Triage, CPR & First Aid' and 'Case study Orissa Super Cyclone' to be the least useful part of the course. This was followed by the topic 'Hazard, Risk and Vulnerability of Cyclones to Gujarat', 'Cyclone Forecasting and Warning', 'Cyclone Mitigation Measures', 'Emergency Response in Cyclone' and 'Water, Sanitation and Health Management in Cyclone' as the least useful part of the course by one participant.

2.10 Overall impression of the course

Twelve participants found the course to be 'excellent'. Seventeen participants found the course to be ranking as 'very good' whereas three participants found the course to be 'good'.

2.11 Specific idea about improvements in your working situation when back to work
